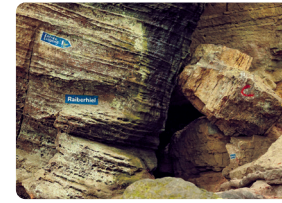
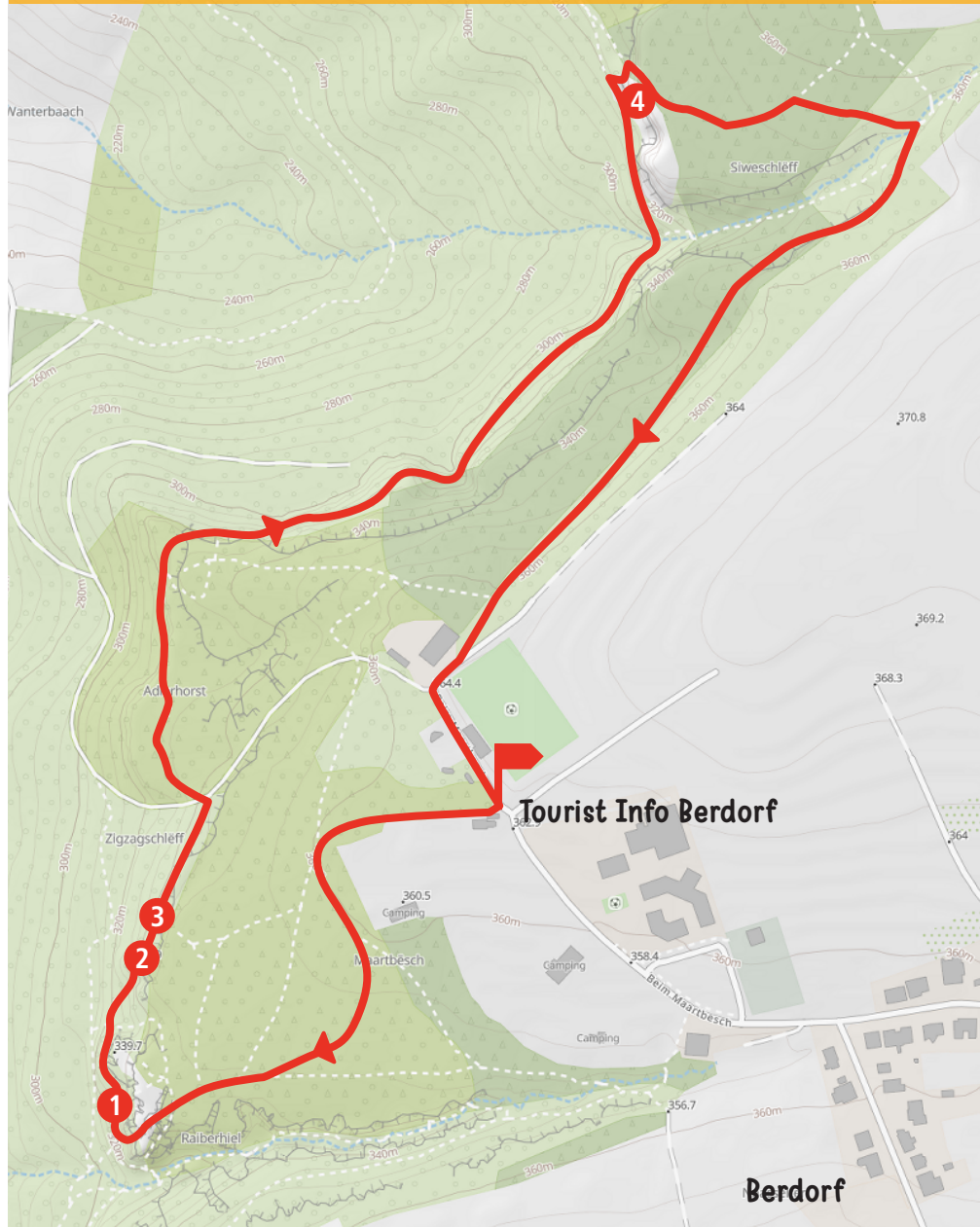

# “Wanterbaach-Siweschlëff” Explorer Nature Trail



## 1. “Raiberhiel”

You access the Robbers' Cave via a gap in the rock. It's a very tight squeeze, and you will need to make yourself as small as possible. From inside the cave, you climb out again via two steep ladders. It's pretty dark inside, so don't forget your torch!

## 2. “Däiwelsinsel”

The Devil's Island is a rocky plateau that you reach via countless steps. At the top, there is a great spot for a commemorative photo and a picnic.



## 3. “Totenkammer (La Morgue)”



As you follow the trail and descend the steps through the rocks, you are suddenly standing in a small, dark cave. It's known as the *Totenkammer*, or morgue. There is a small bench here, so that you can experience the darkness, the smell and the silence. Afterwards, the steps lead out of the cave again.

## 4. “Siweschlëff”

The *Siweschlëff* is a labyrinth that you can explore via seven narrow gaps in the rock. Follow the numbers (1-7). Sometimes it is so narrow that your parents can get stuck (up to 30 cm narrow). It is damp and cold here, enabling moss and ferns to grow.
