"Joffer Margot" Educational Nature Trail

On this educational nature trail in Consdorf, the owl will teach you about the world of plants and animals on the route. The trail runs for 8 km, but there is a short-cut on the way which shortens it to 4.6 km.


Standing at the starting point *Op der Gare* is an aircraft from the Second World War that crashed nearby. The trail leads through Consdorf and along a narrow path to the valley where the Härdbaach stream flows. After a few hundred metres along the forest path, a trail branches off towards the very narrow rock passages *Rittergang* and *Déiwepëtz*. The absolute high point of this walk is the spectacular passage through the pitch-dark *Kuelscheier*, a rock tunnel that is 100 meters long. The *Adventure Kuelscheier* circular trail takes you through the whole labyrinth of rocks.











Wishing Balls for the Pixies



In the small holes and gaps in the rocks around Consdorf, the pixies have their home. The caves and tunnels are too small for humans, but pixies can get through easily. If you go into the forest, however, you can't see the pixies. They are much too quick to let themselves be spotted. The special thing about pixies is that sometimes they make your wish come true.

If you have a wish, then gather some wet soil along the way. Knead it and roll it to make a small ball. You can get creative with it. Gather the soil from one spot and a beautiful leaf or a small stone from somewhere else. Be thinking hard about your wish as you form your ball, and leave it in the forest in a sheltered spot.

Perhaps the pixies will grant you your wish!

Tip: Don't forget to take your torch along!

The three rock passages — Rittergang, Déiwepetz and Kuelscheier — together offer a thrilling adventure.



1. "Rittergang"


On your route via the C2 in Consdorf, the first passage you come to is the *Rittergang*. Walk through the rocks. But beware: it is very dark inside, and you may need to take off your rucksack to fit through the narrow passageway.

2. "Déiwepëtz"

The Déiwepëtz is another gap in the rocks that is very narrow. This passage is open to the sky overhead, and some light falls into it.



3. "Adventure Kuelscheier"



The Kuelscheier is a place for adventurers and explorers. First, you have to get through a dark passage through the rock, over 100 metres long, where you will need a torch. The route through the tunnel is so narrow in places that only "oneway traffic" is possible. When you emerge from the gap through the rock, the trail leads through the rock labyrinth via many stairs and steps. Follow the numbers on the rock. See if you can find the place where it looks as if you can carry the rock. Take a photo of it.

In the past, charcoal was stored in this rock passage. That's where it gets its name from: *Kuelscheier*, meaning "charcoal barn". The gaps in the rocks were used as a kind of stockyard for charcoal.
